The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Twelve

An Act Relative to the Access of Epinephrine in Schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1.

- 2 Section 54B of chapter 71 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition,
- 3 is hereby amended by inserting after the fourth paragraph the following:—
- 4 Notwithstanding any general or special law or regulation to the contrary, a school district
- 5 shall allow a parent or legal guardian of any child to expressly authorize the school department
- and school bus drivers, licensed pursuant to section 8A of chapter 90, to administer epinephrine,
- 7 by means of an epinephrine auto-injector, to his or her child in the case of an allergic emergency.
- 8 The parent or legal guardian shall provide either a letter or prescription from the primary care
- 9 physician of said child notifying the school of the allergy of said child and the need to administer
- 10 epinephrine in an allergic emergency. The school shall promptly notify the school bus service
- provider of the allergy of said child and provide a copy of the letter or prescription from said
- 12 primary care physician.

Notwithstanding any general or special law or regulation to the contrary, a school district shall not prohibit a student with a severe allergy from carrying and using a prescription epinephrine auto-injector while in school or at a school sanctioned function or event, when said prescription epinephrine auto-injector is prescribed by a licensed individual with prescriptive privileges. Said student shall provide the school with medical documentation that said epinephrine auto-injector has been legitimately prescribed and that he or she needs to carry it on his or her person due to a medical condition.
