An Act regarding spouses as caregivers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 9 of Chapter 118 E is hereby amended by adding in the second
2 sentence of the second paragraph, after the words “requirements for Title XIX” the following
3 new language:-- Any program of home and community based services funded pursuant to the
4 provisions of this chapter or pursuant to the provisions chapter one hundred and eighteen G, in
5 which family members are permitted to serve as paid caregivers, shall include spouses within the
6 definition of family member.
