### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to health care provider transportation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1 SECTION 1. Section 51 of Chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby

2 amended by adding the following paragraph:

- 3 Any health care facility licensed pursuant to this section shall provide transportation via
- 4 taxi, car or bus service or other form of private or public transportation for the return commute
- 5 from the institution for all resident physicians, medical students and other health care providers
- 6 who have worked for more than 16 consecutive hours, and for any health care provider who
- 7 judges herself or himself to be too fatigued to safely operate a motor vehicle.
