The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act establishing a state emergency response fund.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 18.5 of Chapter 6A of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
2 amended by inserting the following section:--

3 Section 18.5A. The State Emergency Response Fund, hereinafter referred to as
4 the "fund", is hereby created in the state treasury. Any money donated to the fund or
5 appropriated to the fund by the legislature shall be deposited in the fund. Monies in the fund shall
6 be invested in the same manner as monies in the state general fund. Interest earned on investment
7 of monies in the fund shall be deposited in and credited to the fund. Unexpended and
8 unencumbered monies in the fund shall remain in the fund. Monies in the fund shall be
9 appropriated, administered, and used solely as provided in Subsection B of this Section.

10 Monies in the fund shall be appropriated at the discretion of the Director of the
11 Massachusetts Emergency Management Administration (MEMA), and used to provide a source
12 of funds to pay expenses incurred by local governments as a result of activities associated with
13 the preparation for and response to an emergency or declared disaster following a declaration by
14 the governor, if the local governmental unit or household is within the area designated under the
15 declaration. The expenditure for such a purpose from another source may be eligible to be repaid
16 from the fund if the using agency has certified the necessity of such action to the Director of the
17 Massachusetts Emergency Management Administration (MEMA). Assistance under this Section
18 may be provided only during the 90-day period following the date of declaration of a major
19 disaster or emergency. Monies in the fund may also be utilized to provide bridge funding in
20 anticipation of reimbursements from the federal government or another source. Any
21 reimbursement received for expenses paid from the fund shall be returned to and deposited into
22 the fund.

23 The fund may make low-interest or interest-free loans to local government units
24 to help fund all or part of emergency public works projects. Emergency public works projects
25 shall include the construction, repair, reconstruction, replacement, rehabilitation, or improvement
26 of any public infrastructure damaged or made otherwise unusable within a disaster area. The
27 loans may be used less any reimbursement from any of the following sources: (1) Federal
28 disaster or emergency funds, including funds from the federal emergency management agency;
29 (2) state disaster or emergency funds; (3) insurance settlements; or (4) litigation.
