An Act to enhance the threats statute..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 265 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2004 Official Edition, is hereby
- 2 amended by inserting after Section 13L the following new section:-
- 3 "Section 13M. Threats; arrest.
- 4 Notwithstanding the provisions of sections two and three of chapter two hundred and
- 5 seventy-five or any other general or special law to the contrary, no person shall threaten to
- 6 commit a crime against the person or property of another, under circumstances that would
- 7 reasonably justify apprehension on the part of any ordinary person. A police officer may arrest,
- 8 without a warrant, any person for whom the officer has probable cause to believe is violation or
- 9 has violated this section."
