In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to providing a sick leave allowance to employees of the Department of Developmental Services upon retirement..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 31A of Chapter 29 of the Massachusetts General Laws, as
2 appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting the following:-

3 (e) Employees of the Department of Developmental Services who retire and who have
4 accrued unused sick-leave credits shall be paid or at the option of the employee, entitled to a
5 contribution to a qualified retirement plan established in the employee?s name under section
6 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code and under chapter 32 an amount equal to one hundred
7 percent of the value of such credits computed by multiplying the number of days of sick-leave
8 available times the daily rate of salary compensation received by the employee at the time of his
9 retirement; provided, however, that such payment for unused sick-leave shall not affect the

10 amount of retirement allowance available to the employees of the Department of Developmental
11 Services.
