In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to the sanctity of collective bargaining.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 7(d) of chapter 150E of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006

Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after subsection (q), the following new

4 "(r) sections one through thirty-one, inclusive, of chapter twenty-two C; provided,

however, that any provision of the collective bargaining agreement entered into pursuant to

chapter 150E by the Commonwealth and the employee organization representing the bargaining

unit of the non-commissioned officers of the department of state police which conflicts with any

provision of chapter twenty-two C can be suspended in the event of and only for the duration of

an emergency which requires such suspension. For purposes of the sub-section, an emergency is

defined as a condition in which the safety of the public is in imminent danger, such as a threat to

11	life or health or where immediate law enforcement intervention is required to maintain or restore
12	such public safety."
