- Section 1. Paragraph (b)(1) of sections 22 of Chapter 141 of the Acts of 2003
  is hereby amended by striking out the words "an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000" and
  inserting place the following words:- "an amount deemed necessary to fund qualified projects
  pursuant to 830 CMR 63.38R.1".

  Section 2. Paragraph (b)(1) of sections 24 of Chapter 141 of the Acts of 2003
  is hereby amended by striking out the words "an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000" and
