An Act relative to veterans.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 21 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition, is hereby
2 amended by inserting, after section 3E, the following section:- Veterans, as defined by clause 43,
3 section 7 of chapter 4, shall not be required to pay charges and fees, including day-use parking
4 fees and recreation visitor fees, for entrance to public forest lands and public beaches under the
5 control and care of the department of conservation and recreation.

6 Section 2D of chapter 132A is hereby amended by striking out, in line 16, the words
7 “disabled veteran” and inserting in place thereof the following words:- Veterans, as defined by
8 clause 43, section 7 of chapter 4.
