The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to unlawful discrimination.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 151B of the General Laws, is hereby amended by
2 adding, after the fifth paragraph, the following:- The Commonwealth shall not be deemed an
3 employer of military technicians of the Massachusetts national guard employed pursuant to Title
4 32, section 709 of the United States Code. The Commonwealth shall not be deemed an employer
5 of uniformed military members of the Massachusetts national guard performing duty under the
6 provisions of Title 10 or Title 32 of the United States Code.

7 SECTION 2. Section 1 of chapter 151B, is hereby further amended in the sixth paragraph
8 by inserting, at the end of the paragraph, the following:- Uniformed military members of the
9 Massachusetts National Guard performing duty under the provisions of Title 10 or Title 32 of the
10 United States Code and military technicians employed pursuant to Title 32, section 709 of the

- 11 United States Code, shall not be deemed employees of the Commonwealth for purposes of this
- 12 chapter.
