

SENATE No. 1880

By Mr. Montigny, petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1880) of Mark Montigny and Christopher Markey for legislation to establish a sick leave for Timothy J. Stott, an employee of the Department of Corrections. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act establishing a sick leave for Timothy J. Stott, an employee of the Department of Corrections.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to make a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the Department of Corrections, therefore, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special, or rule or regulation to the
2 contrary, the trial court shall establish a sick leave bank for Timothy J. Stott, an employee of the
3 Department of Corrections. Any employee of said department may voluntarily contribute 1 or
4 more sick, personal or vacation days to the sick leave bank for the use by Timothy J. Stott.
5 Whenever Timothy J. Stott terminates employment with said department or request to dissolve
6 the sick leave bank, the balance of the sick leave bank time shall be transferred to the trial court
7 paid sick leave bank. Sick leave bank days shall not be used for absences unrelated to the illness
8 or disability that necessitated the establishment of the sick leave bank as determined by the
9 department.
