An Act establishing a sick leave bank for Kevin Sitler, an employee of the Department of Corrections.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to make to establish a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the department of corrections, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:, therefore, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public [Emergency Preamble Context].

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law or rule or regulation to
2 the contrary, the department of corrections establish a sick leave bank for Kevin Sitler, an
3 employee of the department. Any employee of a department within the department of
4 corrections may voluntarily contribute 1 or more of his sick, personal or vacation days to the sick
5 leave bank for use by Kevin Sitler. Whenever Kevin Sitler terminates employment with the
6 department or requests to dissolve the sick leave bank, the balance of the sick leave time shall be
7 transferred to the extended illness leave bank.
