An act relative to health reimbursement accounts for the insured employees of the town of Arlington.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the
2 contrary, including but not limited to Chapter Thirty-Two B of the General Laws, if the Town of
3 Arlington transfers its subscribers to the commission in accordance with applicable general or
4 special law, the Town may reimburse its subscribers for the costs of co-payments related to
5 hospitalizations and day surgery through the use of health reimbursement accounts.

6 Section 2. For purposes of this Act, “subscribers” is defined as it is in Section
7 19 of Chapter Thirty-Two B of the General Laws; “commission” means the Group Insurance
8 Commission established by Section 3 of Chapter Thirty-Two A of the General Laws; and “health
9 reimbursement account” means a federally recognized tax-exempt health benefits program that
10 allows employers to reimburse qualified medical expenses paid by employees.

11 Section 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
