The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act establishing a sick leave bank for Nena Canada, an employee of the Trial Court.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to establish a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the Trial Court, therefore, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law or rule or regulation to the
2 contrary, the Trial Court shall establish a sick leave bank for Nena Canada, an employee of the
3 Trial Court. Any employee of the Trial Court may voluntarily contribute 1 or more sick,
4 personal or vacation days to the sick leave bank for the use by Nena Canada. Whenever Nena
5 Canada terminates employment with said department or requests to dissolve the sick leave bank,
6 the balance of the sick leave bank time shall be transferred to the trial court paid sick leave bank.
7 Sick leave bank days shall not be used for absences unrelated to the illness or disability that
8 necessitated the establishment of the sick leave bank as determined by the Trial Court.
