An Act establishing a sick leave bank for James A. O’Connor, an employee of the Division of Professional Licensure.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to establish a sick leave bank for a certain employee of the Division of Professional Licensure , therefore, it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law, or rule, or regulation to the contrary, the
2 Division of Professional Licensure shall establish a sick leave bank for James A. O’Connor, an
3 employee of the Division of Professional Licensure. Any employee of the Division of
4 Professional Licensure may voluntarily contribute 1 or more sick, personal or vacation days to
5 the sick leave bank for use by James A. O’Connor. Whenever James A. O’Connor terminates
6 employment with the office or requests to dissolve the sick leave bank, any remaining time in the
7 sick leave bank shall be transferred to the extended illness leave bank. Sick leave bank days shall
8 not be used for absences unrelated to the illness or disability that necessitated the establishment
9 of the sick leave bank as determined by the Division of Professional Licensure.
