**In the Year Two Thousand Twelve**

An Act exempting the position of police chief in the city of Malden from the civil service law.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the position of  
2 police chief in the city of Malden shall be exempt from chapter 31 of the General Laws.

3           SECTION 2. Section 1 shall not impair the civil service status of the person holding the  
4 position of police chief in the city of Malden on the effective date of this act.

5           SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
