An Act relative to high school graduation requirements.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The second sentence of clause (i) of the fourth paragraph of Section 1D of 2 chapter 69 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2002 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "graduation" the following words:- ", except that revised competency 3 4 determinations coordinated to state frameworks and related and/or rescheduled assessment 5 methods defined under an individual education plan within the context of section 3 of chapter 6 71B, and fulfilled by a student with special needs who also scores two or more years below grade 7 level on a standardized reading test in grade 9 or above and who has failed to pass a grade 10 8 standard competency test at least once, can also determine eligibility for high school graduation."
