An Act promoting the public health of citizens through the testing and labeling of Striped Bass.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1                   SECTION 1. The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection  
2 Office of Research and Standards shall conduct a long-term research program on contaminants in  
3 Striped Bass. Contaminants to be looked for shall include but not be limited to mercury,  
4 polychlorinated biphenyls, dioxin, mirex, dichlorodiphenyltrichloroethane, chlordane and  
5 dieldrin. The results of said research program shall be published annually and forwarded to the  
6 Massachusetts Department of Public Health for the purpose of publishing warnings to the public  
7 should levels of contaminants in the Striped Bass cause health concerns due to consumption of  
8 the fish by pregnant women or the general population. The research program shall be conducted  
9 as to have the maximum impact for the safety of the general population based around the  
10 commercial and recreational Striped Bass fishing season in the Commonwealth. Should there  
11 be a finding of elevated contaminants in Striped Bass by the Massachusetts Department of Public  
12 Health, the Department shall direct the Massachusetts Division of Marine Fisheries to institute a  
13 labeling and notification program for Striped Bass caught commercially and sold for human

- 14 consumption in fish stores, fish markets and on the dock or wharf in Massachusetts as well as
- 15 other markets the fish are sold into.
