The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An act providing an alternative to institutional care.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The division shall provide, within forty-eight hours of a request, up to sixty
2 (60) days of eligibility for MassHealth home and community based services, including personal
3 care services, for individuals who, upon discharge from an acute hospital, medical center,
4 nursing facility, or health care facility including rehabilitation facilities and state hospitals, are
5 eligible for the MassHealth program and permanently or temporarily clinically eligible for home
6 and community based services, as determined by an aging services access point, an independent
7 living center, senior care options provider, or program for all-inclusive services for the elderly;
8 provided further the division shall promulgate such standards and regulations as may be
9 necessary for the administration of said provision of services.
