The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act to provide for tobacco cessation benefits.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 32A of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
2 after section 17H the following section:--

3 Section 17I. The commission shall provide to any active or retired employee of
4 the commonwealth who is insured under the group insurance commission a smoking and tobacco
5 use cessation treatment benefit. Smoking and tobacco use cessation treatment and information
6 benefits shall include nicotine replacement therapy, other evidence-based pharmacologic aids to
7 quitting smoking, and accompanying counseling by a physician, certified tobacco use cessation
8 counselor, or other qualified clinician.

9 SECTION 2. Chapter 118H of the General Laws is hereby amended by

10 inserting the following section:

11 Section 7. Any policy of insurance for accident or sickness, or agreement for
12 medical or health services, which shall be delivered or issued or renewed or certified in this
13 Commonwealth through the Commonwealth Care Health Insurance Program described in
14 Chapter 118H of the General Laws, shall provide as a benefit to all individual subscribers and
15 members within the Commonwealth, for expenses of tobacco use cessation treatment as
16 hereinafter set forth. Smoking and tobacco use cessation treatment and information benefits
17 shall include nicotine replacement therapy, other evidence-based pharmacologic aids to quitting
18 smoking, and accompanying counseling by a physician, certified tobacco use cessation
19 counselor, or other qualified clinician.
