Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of Chapter 217 of the General Laws, as appearing in

- 2 the 2008 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the fifth sentence and inserting in
- 3 place thereof the following sentence:- Any person aggrieved by a decision of a chief justice
- 4 concerning such a dispute between said first justice and said register may appeal said decision to
- 5 the chief justice for administration and management, who shall, within thirty days, hear and
- 6 determine the matter.
