An Act relative to personal recognizance..

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 58 of chapter 276 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-

3           Notwithstanding any general or special law, rule or regulation to the contrary, no person  
4 who has been previously convicted, without having that conviction vacated, of an offense  
5 involving the use or possession of a firearm, rifle, shotgun, machine gun, sawed-off shotgun,  
6 large capacity weapon or assault weapon as defined in section 121 of chapter 140 or a covert  
7 weapon as defined in section 131N of chapter 140, shall be eligible for release on personal  
8 recognizance without surety.
