An Act relative to deceptive weapons.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 121 of Chapter 140 of the General Laws, as appearing in
2 the 2008 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting the following definition:-

3 “Deceptive Weapon Device” Any device or item used in the commission of a crime that
4 is intended to convey the presence of a weapon, as defined in this section, to a potential victim or
5 law enforcement officer. Such devices or items shall include, but are not limited to, common air
6 guns, toy guns, or substances carved or fashioned to resemble a weapon.

7 SECTION 2. Chapter 265 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
8 amended by inserting the following new section:-

9 Section 45. Crimes committed with a deceptive weapon device.

10 Any person who is in possession of a deceptive weapon device as defined in Section 121
11 of Chapter 140 of the General Laws, during the commission of a violent crime as defined in

- 12 Section 121 of Chapter 140 of the General Laws shall be deemed to be armed and shall be
- 13 punishable by penalties set forth in this chapter.
