## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

An Act to reduce teen smoking ..

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 270 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding after

2 Section 6A the following additional new section:

3 "Section 6B. Whoever shall, while under the age of eighteen, be in possession of a
4 cigarette, chewing tobacco, snuff, or any tobacco in any of its forms not given to that person by
5 his parent or guardian shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten and no more than twenty6 five dollars. If the offense is committed while on the property of a public school, it shall be
7 permissible for administrative and teaching personnel of that school to confiscate the tobacco
8 product."
