An Act providing municipal control of liquor licenses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 138 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 17 and inserting in place thereof the following section:-
- 3 Section 17. The legislative body of each city or town that has voted to grant
- 4 licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages as provided in section 11 shall determine the number
- 5 of licenses issued in the city or town under sections 12 and 15. Cities or towns that have voted to
- 6 grant licenses as provided in section 11 may grant seasonal licenses under section 12 in a number
- 7 determined by the legislative body. Cities or towns that have voted to grant licenses as provided
- 8 in section 11 may grant licenses under sections 12, 15 or 15F to the holder of a farmer-winery
- 9 license under section 19B in a number determined by the legislative body.
- SECTION 3. Sections 17A, 7B and 17C of said chapter 138 are hereby
- 11 repealed.

- SECTION 4. The number of licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages
- allowed by prior law shall continue in force until changed by the legislative body under section
- 14 17 of chapter 138 of the General Laws.
