An Act relative to children's mental health clinicians..

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 22 of chapter 32A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word “setting”, in line 85, the
3 following words: - "and, for persons under the age of 19, shall include collateral services"

4 SECTION 2. Subsection (i) of said section 22 of said chapter 32A, as so
5 appearing, is hereby amended by striking out the last paragraph.

6 SECTION 3. Said section 22 of said chapter 32A, as so appearing, is hereby
7 amended by adding the following subsection:—

8 Under this section, the following words shall have the following meanings
9 unless the context requires otherwise:-

10 “Collateral services”, face-to-face or telephonic consultation, of at least 15
11 minutes in duration, by a licensed mental health professional with parties determined by the
12 licensed mental health professional to be necessary to make a diagnosis, and develop and
13 implement a treatment plan.

14 “Licensed mental health professional”, a licensed physician who specializes in
15 the practice of psychiatry, a licensed psychologist, a licensed independent clinical social worker,
16 a licensed mental health counselor, a licensed nurse mental health clinical specialist or a licensed
17 marriage and family therapist.

18 SECTION 4. Chapter 118E of the General Laws, as so appearing, is amended
19 by inserting after section 10F the following section:—

20 Section 10G. (a) The division shall provide coverage for collateral services
21 performed by a licensed mental health professional for persons under 19 years of age. Nothing
22 contained in this section shall be construed to abrogate any obligation to provide coverage for
23 mental health services pursuant to any law or regulation of the commonwealth or the United
24 States or under the terms or provisions of any policy, contract, or certificate.

25 (b) Under this section, the following words shall have the following
26 meanings unless the context requires otherwise:-

27 “Collateral services”, face-to-face or telephonic consultation, of at least 15
28 minutes in duration, by a licensed mental health professional with parties determined by the

39 appearing, is hereby amended by striking out the second and third paragraphs.

40 SECTION 7. Said section 47B of said chapter 175, as so appearing, is hereby
41 further amended by adding the following 2 subsections:—
