# The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to equitable dental reimbursement rates for services provided to publicly aided patients.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

Section 7 of Chapter 118G of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the
following:-

The executive office shall develop a plan to index the child and adult dental fee schedule to the seventy fifth percentile of the most current American Dental Association Survey of Dental Fees of General Practitioners by January 1, 2015. The plan, at a minimum, shall include all

6 dental services covered as of January 1, 2009.
