An Act to preserve access to inpatient mental health services for individuals with mental illness.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 265 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting at the end of Section  
2 13I:

3 If the person alleged to have committed an assault or assault and battery was at the time  
4 of the alleged incident: 1) transported or held subject to Mass. Gen. L. ch. 123, § 12, §§ 10 & 11  
5 or §§ 7 & 8; or 2) determined by mental health providers to need psychiatric evaluation or  
6 treatment, that person will not be charged under the provisions of this section but will be  
7 provided with mental health evaluation and treatment in accordance with Chapter 123.
