The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act to ban K-2 in the Commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 94C of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting, after the definition of “Isomer”, the following
3 definition: -

4 “‘K-2’ or ‘spice’, any form of cannabis, including synthetic compounds or structures that
5 are molecularly similar to cannabis, shall be included in this definition.”

6 SECTION 2. Subparagraph (b) of paragraph (e) of section 31 of said chapter 94C is
7 hereby amended by adding, after the words and number “(4) 1-Nitrosoxy-Mthel-Propane.”, the
8 following words and number:-

9 (5) K-2 or Spice.

10 SECTION 3. Sections 32L, 32M, and 34 of said chapter 94C, are hereby amended by
11 inserting, after the word “marijuana”, in each instance, the following words:-
