An Act relative to mandated reporters.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 21 of chapter 119 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking, in lines 50 and 51, the words “or (vi) the child
3 advocate” and inserting in place thereof the following: (vi) the child advocate; or (vii) a state
4 employee who, in his professional capacity, witnesses child abuse, including sexual abuse.
