Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 92 of chapter 41 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking, in line 13, the figure“\$7,000”, and inserting in
3 place thereof the following figure:-

5 SECTION 2. Said section 92 of said chapter 41, as so appearing, is hereby further
6 amended by striking, in line 14, the figure “\$7,000”, and inserting in place thereof the following
7 figure:-
