An Act regulating fees for the registration of attorneys.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 211 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the  
2 following section:—

3 Section 29. The Board of Bar Overseers shall not assess an annual registration fee for  
4 attorneys who retire from the practice of law, sitting judges, clerk-magistrates, as defined in  
5 Canon 1 of Supreme Judicial Court Rule 3:12, Federal clerks of court, chief deputy clerks and  
6 deputy clerks, employees of the General Court, District Attorneys and their assistants, the  
7 Attorney General and his assistants, attorneys employed by the Committee for Public Counsel  
8 Services, and attorneys employed by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts who do not otherwise  
9 engage in the practice of law.
