An Act relative to police officer access to probation records.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 167 of chapter 6 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010  
2   Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word “rehabilitation”, in line 32, the  
3   following words:- conditions of any person on probation.

4           SECTION 2. Section 168A of said chapter 6, as so appearing, is hereby amended by  
5   adding the following paragraph:-

6           The board shall include in the criminal offender record information all conditions of any  
7   person on probation transmitted under this section by the commissioner of probation to the  
8   board. Such information contained in said system shall be made available by the board to police  
9   officers upon request without fee.
