### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act regarding proportional payments of the Massachusetts Child Psychiatry Access Project.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

## SECTION 1. Chapter 19 of the General Laws is hereby amended by hereby amended by inserting after section 16 the following section:-

3 Section 16A.

(a) The department shall operate a statewide program to provide mental health
consultations by telephone, available for a minimum of 5 days a week, to pediatricians, family
physicians, nurse practitioners and primary care practices for persons under the age of 19 who
exhibit a possible mental health or substance use disorder.

8 (b) Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the costs of 9 this program shall be assessed on surcharge payers under section 38 of chapter 118G and may be 10 collected in a manner consistent with said chapter 118. All surcharge revenue generated under 11 this section shall be allocated to support the program, including an expansion into educational 12 settings.
