## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

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In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen  
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An Act relative to ensuring sanitary condition in physician's offices.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 5 of Chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended, in paragraph 2, by inserting the following sentences at the  
3 end thereof:- “Said unit may inspect any licensee’s office at any time during regular business  
4 hours, and without notice, for the purposes of verifying that the office is clean and sanitary, that  
5 the licensee has all appropriate and necessary equipment as determined by the board and that  
6 patient records are maintained in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.”
