## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act to protect little lungs.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

SECTION 1. Section 7AA of Chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
 adding the following subsection at the end thereof:

4 (1) No person or persons shall be allowed to smoke, as defined in Section 22, Chapter
5 270 of the General Laws, in a motor vehicle in which a child is required by the provisions of this
6 chapter to be secured by a by a child passenger restraint.

8 An operator or passenger of a motor vehicle who violates the provisions of this section9 shall be subject to a fine of \$100.

10 The provisions of this section shall be enforced by law enforcement agencies. A law 11 enforcement officer may not search or inspect a motor vehicle, its contents, the driver, or a 12 passenger solely because of a violation of this section. For a period of 90 days following the 13 effective date of this act, any law enforcement official who stops a motorist solely because of a 14 violation of this section shall not issue a citation, but shall issue a verbal or written warning.

A violation of this section shall not be used as evidence of contributory negligence in anycivil action.

- 18 A person who receives a citation for a violation of any of the provisions of this section
- 19 may contest such citation pursuant to section three of chapter ninety C. A violation of this
- 20 section shall not be deemed to be a conviction of a moving violation of the motor vehicle laws
- 21 for the purpose of determining surcharges on motor vehicle premiums pursuant to section one
- 22 hundred and thirteen B of chapter one hundred and seventy-five.
