## The Commonmealth of $\mathfrak{f l l a s s a c h u s e t t s}$

## In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act providing access to patient protection services for all Massachusetts residents.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provision of any general or special law to the contrary, every resident of Massachusetts shall have access to the standards and procedures established under sections $13,14,15$, and 16 of chapter 1760 . Such standards shall be administered and enforced by the office of patient protection established by section 217 of chapter 111. The executive office of health and human services shall request waivers from any federal laws or regulations which impede the effective implementation of this Act.
