An Act relative to firefighters.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Notwithstanding any General or Special Law to the contrary the Department of Public  
2 Health is hereby directed to reduce renewal fees for registration at any level for Emergency  
3 Medical Technician, for any person who is employed by an entity under the provisions of  
4 M.G.L. Chapter 32, to the fee charged in the year 2001. Any firefighter who as a condition of  
5 employment must be so certified shall have the fees frozen at said 2001 levels
