**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen**

An Act relative to the removal or transportation of trash.

*Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to allow for the placement of time restrictions on the removal or transportation of trash in business and commercial areas, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 31A of chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 6, the words “business, commercial or”.
