## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

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In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen  
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An Act requiring carbon monoxide alarms in all residential, governmental and commercial structures.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 26F ½ of chapter 148 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008  
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 3, the words “occupied in whole or in  
3 part for residential purposes.”

4           SECTION 2. Section 26F ½ of chapter 148 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008  
5 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 21, the words “occupied in whole or  
6 in part for residential purposes.”

7           SECTION 3. Section 26F ½ of chapter 148 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008  
8 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 28, the words “occupied in whole or  
9 in part for residential purposes.”
