By Mr. Diehl of Whitman, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2138) of Geoff Diehl and others relative to the training and hiring standards for municipal police officers. Public Safety and Homeland Security.

The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act to further professionalize municipal police officers and their training.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 2	Chapter 6: Section 116 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the section in its entirety and inserting the following:-
3	Chapter 6: Section 116. Definitions of terms used in Sections 116 through 119
4 5	Section 116. The following words shall, whenever used in this section or in sections 116 through 119, inclusive, have the following meanings unless the context otherwise requires:
6 7	(1) Commission: The Massachusetts Police Officer Standards and Training Commission (MPOST) or its agency staff acting on its behalf, where applicable, or both.
8 9	(2) Executive Director: The executive director of the Massachusetts Police Officers Standards and Training Commission.
10 11 12	(3) Full-time Police Officer: A person who receives an appointment to a permanent full-time position in which he will exercise police powers as a municipal, University of Massachusetts, or environmental police officer.
13 14	(4) Part-time Officer: Any police officer who works less than XXX hours per [timeframe], whether paid or unpaid.
15 16 17	(5) Police Officer: A person empowered to exercise police powers in a fulltime, part- time, or volunteer capacity with a municipal, University of Massachusetts, or Massachusetts environmental police agency.

18 (6) Recruit Training: All entry-level police academies and reserve intermittent19 training programs.

(7) Reserve/Intermittent Police Officer: A person who receives an appointment to a
 part-time position in which he will exercise police powers as municipal, University of
 Massachusetts, or environmental police officer, whether paid or unpaid.

(8) Reserve/Intermittent Training Program: An entry-level training program operated
 or approved by the Commission that has the prescribed course of study that a reserve/intermittent
 police officer must satisfactorily complete prior to exercising police powers in Massachusetts.

Chapter 6: Section 116A. Municipal police standards and training commission; members;
 chairperson; nomination of executive director

28 Section 116A. There shall be a Massachusetts police standards and training commission 29 within the executive office of public safety. Members of said commission shall be as follows: 4 30 chiefs of police to be appointed by the governor from nominations submitted by the 31 Massachusetts Chiefs of Police Association, 1 of whom shall be from the western Massachusetts 32 region, 1 of whom shall be from the central Massachusetts region, 1 of whom shall be from the 33 southeastern Massachusetts region, and 1 of whom shall be from the northeastern Massachusetts 34 region, the chief of police of the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority Transit Police, 1 35 chief of police selected by the Massachusetts Chiefs of Police Association, 1 police officer to be 36 appointed by the governor from nominations submitted by the Massachusetts Police Association 37 executive board, the commissioner of police of the city of Boston, the colonel of state police, the 38 attorney general, 1 person to be designated by the secretary of public safety, or their respective 39 designees, a district attorney appointed by the Massachusetts District Attorneys Association, and 40 a college faculty member in public administration or a related field appointed by the governor. 41 All such appointments shall be for terms of 3 years with their successors appointed in a like 42 manner. A member may be appointed for additional terms.

43 The commission shall elect a chairperson annually and shall, as needed, provide 44 nominations for the selection of an executive director to the secretary of public safety. The 45 secretary shall select an executive director from the nominations submitted by the commission. 46 The nominees shall have practical and academic knowledge in the field of policing, including 47 substantial administrative experience and a degree or degrees in criminology, police 48 administration, or other similar field or any equivalent combination of education and experience. 49 The position of executive director shall be classified in accordance with section 45 of chapter 30 50 and the salary shall be determined in accordance with section 46C of said chapter 30. 51 Chapter 6: Section 116B. Massachusetts police standards and training commission;

52 powers and duties

Section 116B: The commission shall establish minimum police officer hiring standards,
including minimum age, physical and mental standards, citizenship, good moral character,
experience, and other such matters as relate to the competence and reliability of persons to
assume and discharge the responsibilities of their offices.

57 The commission shall establish standards for licensure and training of municipal police 58 officers, candidates for appointment as municipal police officers, environmental law enforcement 59 officers and the University of Massachusetts police officers in accordance with applicable laws 60 and regulations, including requirements concerning courses of study, attendance, equipment and 61 facilities for police officer training; basic recruit training requirements for police officers 62 appointed on a fulltime basis; basic recruit training requirements for part-time or reserve/intermittent police officers; and categories or classifications of advanced in service 63 64 training programs and minimum courses of study and attendance requirements with respect to

65 the categories or classifications.

66 The commission may grant licensure for police officers who comply with this [act] and 67 suspend said license for failure to comply with this [act] or the rules of the commission. Said 68 license may also be suspended for police officers who knowingly falsified or omitted material 69 information on an application for training or licensure to the commission; who have been 70 convicted at any time of a felony offense under the laws of this state or has been convicted of a 71 federal or out-of-state offense comparable to a felony under the laws of this state; or whose 72 license was previously issued by administrative error on the part of the commission

73 The commission shall review and recommend to the secretary an annual appropriation for 74 the administration of the commission, as well as for the operations of a headquarters and regional 75 training centers, and for the delivery of standardized training at the centers.

Chapter 6: Section 116C. Executive director; powers and duties

77 Section 116C: The executive director shall be responsible for the implementation of the 78 commission's training standards, the maintenance of related training records, and the supervision 79 of staff, facilities, and day-to-day operations and shall provide the commission with a monthly 80 report regarding staff activities and police training. In addition, the executive director shall 81 oversee the development of curricula; the setting of standards for instructor certification and 82 course completion; the establishment of processes for the implementation of commission training standards and for meeting other police training needs as identified by staff and the commission; 83 84 the inspection of the sites, records, and training for approved training programs to assure compliance; and such other duties as are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purposes of 85 86 this section. The executive director is authorized to withhold licensure from any officer not 87 meeting the standards established by the commission, to establish reasonable fees for services as permitted by law to help defray the costs of training, to enter into contracts and leases, and to 88

89 apply for and accept grants on behalf of the Massachusetts police training commission for

90 purposes of police training.

94 Chapter 6: Section 117. Meetings; compensation of members

95 Section 117. The commission shall meet monthly and at other times when ordered by the

96 governor, secretary or chairman or upon the written request of 3 members. A majority of

97 commission members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of commission business.

98 Commission members shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for their

99 necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of their official commission duties.

100 Chapter 6: Section 118. Municipal police training schools; approval; rules and regulations101 relative to schools

102 Section 118. The Massachusetts police training commission shall approve or disapprove 103 municipal, University of Massachusetts, and environmental police recruit training schools and 104 shall make rules and regulations subject to the approval of the governor and council, for such 105 schools, relating to courses of study, attendance requirements, equipment and facilities and qualifications of instructors and such other rules and regulations related to police training 106 107 standards as may be necessary. The commission is authorized to conduct site visits and inspect 108 the records of approved schools for purposes of assuring compliance with training requirements. 109 Regulations adopted by the Commission shall apply to all agencies and local governments in 110 Massachusetts that employ persons as municipal, University of Massachusetts or Massachusetts 111 environmental police officers.

112 Chapter 6: Section 118A. Legislative intent.

113 Section 118A. It is the intent of the General Court in creating the Massachusetts Police 114 Standards and Training Commission to provide for the coordination of standards and training 115 programs for municipal, University of Massachusetts or Massachusetts environmental police 116 officers.

124 Chapter 41: Section 96B. Police training schools; supervisory training; attendance by 125 persons exercising police powers; wages and expenses; exceptions; removal for failure to attend

126 Section 96B. Every person who receives an appointment to a position on a full-time basis 127 in which he will exercise police powers in the police department of any city or town, the 128 University of Massachusetts or the Massachusetts environmental police, shall, prior to exercising 129 police powers, be assigned to and satisfactorily complete a prescribed course of study approved 130 by the Massachusetts police standards and training commission. The provisions of chapter thirty-131 one and any collective bargaining agreement notwithstanding, any person so attending such a 132 school shall be deemed to be a student officer and shall be exempted from the provisions of 133 chapter thirty-one and any collective bargaining agreement for that period during which he is 134 assigned to a police basic recruit training school, provided that such person shall be paid the 135 regular wages provided for the position to which he was appointed and such reasonable expenses 136 as may be determined by the appointing authority and be subject to the provisions of chapter one 137 hundred and fifty-two.

138 Every police officer on a full-time basis in any such municipal, University of 139 Massachusetts, or the Massachusetts environmental police department, shall be assigned to and 140 shall attend a prescribed course of study approved by the Massachusetts police standards and 141 training commission for in-service officers training and continuing education at such intervals 142 and for such periods as said commission may determine. Any such police officer who receives an 143 appointment to a position of higher rank shall, in addition, complete such other courses of 144 supervisory training as said commission may determine. While attending such school or 145 completing such courses, such persons shall be paid his regular wages as a police officer and 146 shall receive such reasonable expenses as may be determined by the appointing authority.

147 Each person appointed as a reserve or intermittent police officer in a city or town, at the 148 University of Massachusetts, or in the Massachusetts environmental police shall, prior to 149 exercising police powers, satisfactorily complete a course of study prescribed by said 150 commission. Any such officer shall also be assigned to and shall attend a prescribed course of 151 study approved by the Massachusetts police standards and training commission for in-service officers training and continuing education at such intervals and for such periods as said 152 153 commission may determine. Any such police officer who receives an appointment to a position 154 of higher rank shall, in addition, complete such other courses of supervisory training as said 155 commission may determine.

156 Upon petition to the Massachusetts police standards and training commission by the 157 appointing authority, a person appointed to a position on a full-time, reserve, or intermittent basis 158 in which he will exercise police powers in the police department of any city or town, at the

159 University of Massachusetts, or in the Massachusetts environmental police may be exempted by

160 said commission, in whole or in part, from the provisions of this section prior to his exercising

161 police powers. The requirement that training be completed prior to exercising any police powers

162 may be waived by said commission.

Failure of an appointed person to satisfactorily meet the standards set by the commission and to complete all prescribed courses of study may result in the commission withdrawing or withholding the appointed person's license. Upon the commission withdrawing or withholding the appointed person's license, the appointing authority shall remove the appointed person from his position as a police officer until such time as the license is reinstated.

168 Chapter 41: Section 96C. Police officer minimum qualifications

169 Section 96C. No agency or any other person authorized by law to appoint municipal, 170 University of Massachusetts or Massachusetts environmental police officers in this state shall 171 appoint any person as a police officer who does not meet the following qualifications. The 172 person shall:

- 173 (1) Be a United States citizen;
- 174 (2) Be at least 18 years of age;

175 (3) Be fingerprinted. Local, state and national fingerprint files shall be searched to 176 determine if the applicant has a criminal record;

177 (4) Not have been convicted of a crime for which he could have been imprisoned in a178 federal penitentiary or state prison;

179 (5) Hold a high school diploma or evidence of an equivalent achievement;

(6) Have good moral character as determined by a background investigation. The
hiring agency shall complete a background investigation as defined by the commission of any
applicant for employment as a police officer before the applicant may be employed or begin
training as a police officer;

(7) Be free of any physical, emotional or mental conditions which might adversely
affect his performance of duty as a police officer. Emotional and mental conditions shall be
evaluated by a licensed psychologist or psychiatrist; and

187 (8) Pass an oral interview examination by the hiring agency.

A person who is convicted of a felony after his appointment as a police officer is
 ineligible for continued employment as a police officer. If the person has been licensed by the
 Massachusetts police standards and training commission, his licensure shall be automatically

- 191 revoked on the date of his conviction. The executive director shall notify the person and the
- 192 person's employing agency upon revocation of licensure under this subsection.
- Chapter 147: Section 31. Names and status of police officers sent to Massachusetts police
 training commission; failure to send names
- 195 The chief of police, commissioner, or chief executive of any municipal, University of
- 196 Massachusetts, and Massachusetts environmental police department and the clerk of each town
- in which no chief of police or city marshal is appointed shall, within fifteen days after such
- appointment, notify the executive director of the Massachusetts police standards and training
- commission of the name of any person appointed to a fulltime, reserve, or intermittent policeofficer position and shall, within fifteen days after such actions, send to the executive director of
- 201 the Massachusetts police training commission the names of all the police officers, including
- 202 fulltime, part-time, reserve, and intermittent officers, who have resigned, retired, been
- 203 terminated, died, or otherwise had a change of status using forms prescribed by the commission.
- 204 If he neglects or refuses so to do, he shall be punished by a fine of fifty dollars.
