An Act Relative to Elevator Inspection Fees.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 64 of the Massachusetts General is hereby amended by inserting at  
2 the end thereof the following: “A non-profit or charitable organization may apply for a waiver to  
3 the state elevator inspection fee.” .
