An Act relative to the lawful sale of ammunition.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 123 of Chapter 140 of the Massachusetts General Laws shall be  
2 amended by inserting the following language at the end of the section:

3           Notwithstanding any special law or regulation to the contrary nothing in this section shall  
4 be deemed as requiring a company outside of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to be  
5 required to be licensed under this section. Said companies shall be entitled to sell ammunition to  
6 persons properly licensed to possess or sell ammunition to those licensed under sections 122,  
7 122B, 129B or 131 of this chapter, through the internet, U.S. Mail or by any other means  
8 common to interstate commerce. All deliveries of ammunition under this paragraph, whether in  
9 person or by common carrier, must require the signature of the licensee or their adult agent.
