Golden, Jr. and James Arciero (by vote of the town) for legislation to authorize the town of Chelmsford to continue the employment of Michael Curran as fire chief. Public Service. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act authorizing the town of Chelmsford to continue the employment of Fire Chief Michael Curran.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, Michael 1 2 Curran, chief of the fire department of the town of Chelmsford, may continue to serve in such 3 position until June 30, 2015, until the date of his retirement, or until the date he is relieved of his 4 duties by the town manager, whichever occurs first; provided, however, that he is mentally and 5 physically capable of performing the duties of his office. The Board of Selectmen may, at its 6 own expense, require that Michael Curran be examined by an impartial physician designated by 7 them to determine such capability. No further deductions shall be made from the regular 8 compensation of Michael Curran under chapter 32 of the General Laws for any service 9 subsequent to July 18, 2013, and upon retirement, he shall receive a superannuation retirement 10 allowance equal to that which he would have been entitled had he retired on his date.

11 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
