An Act relative to authorizing a local option for group classification.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Paragraph (g) of subdivision (2) of section 3 of chapter 32 of the General  
2 Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after line 307  
3 the following new paragraph:-

4           Any municipality or public authority may elect to improve the retirement group  
5 classification for any group of employees of the municipality or the public authority upon its  
6 acceptance in the following manner: in a city having a Plan D or a Plan E charter by majority  
7 vote of its city council and approved by the manager; in any other city by majority vote of the  
8 city council and approved by the mayor; in a town by vote of the board of selectmen; in a public  
9 authority by majority vote of the authority governing board. Nothing in this act shall be  
10 construed as authorization to diminish the retirement benefits of public employees by placing  
11 any group of employees in a lower group of classification.
