An Act reaffirming the spirit of volunteerism.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 1. Chapter 7 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition, is  
2 hereby amended by inserting after section 6F the following section:-

3           Section 6G. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, no executive  
4 agency shall permit a state employee, as defined by section 1 of chapter 268A, to serve as a  
5 volunteer to a corporation, formed for any one or more of the purposes mentioned in section 4 of  
6 chapter 180, during normal business hours; provided however, that such agency may permit an  
7 employee to volunteer during normal business hours if the employee has exhausted all accrued  
8 vacation time and personal days.
