An Act relative to the retirement rights of criminal prosecutors..

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Paragraph (g) of subdivision (2) of section 3 of Chapter 32 of the General  
2 Laws is hereby amended by inserting after the word “more” the words:— , assistant attorney  
3 general for criminal matters which shall include individuals whose primary responsibility is the  
4 prosecution of criminal matters on behalf of the attorney general, as so certified by the attorney  
5 general.
