By Mr. Michlewitz of Boston, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2673) of Aaron Michlewitz and Michael Butler for legislation to exempt unemployed residents from the payment of tax penalties to the Commonwealth. Revenue.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to unemployment tax relief.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 An Act relative to unemployment tax relief

2 SECTION 1: A resident of the Commonwealth who is unemployed, as defined in
3 subsection (r) of Section 1 in Chapter 151A of the General Laws, shall be exempted from paying
4 any tax penalties to the Commonwealth, as defined in Title IX of the General Laws, when
5 withdrawing funds from any banking savings account, retirement account programs, or any other
6 investment account when the purpose of the withdrawals is to pay for cost of living
7 commitments by the unemployed individual. Cost of living commitments shall include:

- 8 1) Mortgage or rent payments
- 9 2) Utilities payments
- 10 3) Food payments
- 11 4) Any other commitments that the Department of Revenue shall deem appropriate

12 SECTION 2: The unemployed individual shall provide appropriate statements to the
13 Department of Revenue to verify the legitimacy of the withdrawals from said accounts to pay the
14 cost of living commitments of said individual.
