By Mr. Collins of Boston, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2793) of Nick Collins that certain contracts issued for services require the employment of a minimum number of individuals with disabilities. State Administration and Regulatory Oversight.

The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to employment of persons with disabilities.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Chapter 7 of the Massachusetts General Laws is hereby amended by placing after Section 38P the following:-
- SECTION 38Q. (a) Any contract issued for services in the Commonwealth of
 Massachusetts or any political subdivision there-in that receives appropriated funds from the
 legislature of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts shall at a minimum employ 20% of
 individuals hired within that contract be individuals with disabilities.
 - (b) Such services shall include but not be limited to janitorial and custodial services, landscaping services, mailroom services, food services, fleet management, manufacturing, trash removal, document destruction, electronic scanning of documents, and facility management services including but not limited to HVAC Services, Painting, Emergency Repair Services, and Snow Removal.
 - (c) For the purposes of this act, an individual with disability will be defined as any person with a physical, developmental, mental, or other disability as determined by any Department or Agency of the Executive Office of Human Services or any other political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and/or by any vocational rehabilitation non-profit of for-profit agency in the Commonwealth, or by any licensed professional including but not limited to medical doctors, psychiatrists, nurses, social workers, vocational rehabilitation counselors, and psychologists.
