Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 18 of chapter 30A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official
2 Edition, is hereby amended in the definition of "Public Body", by striking the phrase "the general
3 court or the committees or recess committees thereof".
